The Council approved a request by the North Tonawanda Neighborhood Watch, led by Chairman Joseph Marranca Jr., for a Dyngus Day Celebration on April 5 on Oliver Street. A parade down Oliver Street between 11th Ave and 1st Ave will end at Dom Polski's and Oliver Street will be closed between these streets from 4:30pm - 7:30pm so the city can celebrate its rich ethnic heritage.
